That list of topics was not exhaustive, nor would it prevent initiation of action in other aspects of ocean problems. UNEP had inherited, in this connexion, a considerable amount of knowledge and experience from the Stockholm Conference which, throughout its preparatory process, organized intergovernmental meetings on the oceans and marine environment such as the Intergovernmental Working Group on Marine Pollution, whose strenuous efforts generated - among other things - the Statement of Objectives and the General Principles for Assessment and Control of Marine Pollution endorsed by the Stockholm Conference (see A/CONF.48/14) and the General Assembly, and also the London Ocean Dumping Convention. It would be thus most appreciated if this responsibility of co-ordinating United Nations activities in the field of the protection of the marine environment was recognized and articulated by the forthcoming Conference on the Law of the Sea.
