Election to fill a vacancy on the Finance Committee, in accordance with section 9, paragraph 5, of the annex to the Agreement relating to the Implementation of Part XI of the United Nations Convention on the Law of the Sea of 10 December 1982

Note by the Secretary-General

1. The Assembly of the International Seabed Authority is invited to note that Yedla Umasankar (India) resigned from the Finance Committee with effect from 24 November 2021. He had been elected by the Assembly at its twenty-third session as a member of the Committee for the remainder of the term of Koteswara M. Rao (India) ending on 31 December 2021. In line with the decision of the Assembly concerning the extension of the terms of office of the current members of the Committee,¹ his term had been extended until 31 December 2022.

2. Section 9, paragraph 5, of the annex to the Agreement relating to the Implementation of Part XI of the United Nations Convention on the Law of the Sea of 10 December 1982 provides that, in the event of the death, incapacity or resignation of a member of the Committee prior to the expiration of the term of office, the Assembly shall elect for the remainder of the term a member from the same geographical region or group of States.

3. By a note verbale dated 24 November 2021, the Permanent Mission of India to the United Nations informed the secretariat of the Authority of the nomination of Kajal Bhat to fill the seat on the Committee left vacant by Mr. Umasankar for the remainder of his term ending on 31 December 2022. The curriculum vitae of Ms. Bhat is contained in the annex to the present note.²
