MR. AMADOU JAITEH HEAD OF THE DELEGATION OF THE REPUBLIC OF THE GAMBIA

AT THE

TWENTY-FIFTH SESSION OF THE ASSEMBLY OF THE INTERNATIONAL SEABED AUTHORITY

TUESDAY 23rd JULY 2019

KINGSTON, JAMAICA

Madam. President, Mr. Secretary- General, Excellencies, Distinguished delegates, Ladies and Gentlemen.

I bring to you greetings of peace and prosperity from the people of the Republic of The Gambia. My delegation aligns itself with the statement delivered by the distinguished delegate of Algeria, my brother Mehdi, on behalf of the African Group. My statement will not repeat most of what has already said on behalf Africa but rather to highlight with a view to adding emphasis on some points.

Madam President I wish to congratulate you on your very successful election by acclamation to the high and coveted position of President of the Twenty-fifth Session of the International Seabed Authority Assembly. We the Assembly, has indeed made history as we commemorate 25 years of history with a distinguished female at the helm of this body.
