# Election to fill two vacancies on the Finance Committee in accordance with section 9 of the annex to the Agreement relating to the implementation of Part XI of the United Nations Convention on the Law of the Sea

#### Note by the Secretary-General

- 1. The Assembly is invited to note that Soe Lynn Han (Myanmar) and Neeru Chadha (India) have resigned from the Finance Committee effective 9 March 2010. Mr. Han was elected by the Assembly at the fourteenth session to replace Kyaw Moe Tun for the remainder of his term expiring on 31 December 2011. Mrs. Chadha was elected as a member of the Finance Committee for a term of five years beginning 1 January 2007.
- 2. Section 9, paragraph 5, of the annex to the Agreement relating to the implementation of Part XI of the United Nations Convention on the Law of the Sea (the "Agreement") provides that, in the event of the death, incapacity or resignation of a member of the Finance Committee prior to the expiration of the term of office, the Assembly shall elect for the remainder of the term a member from the same geographical region or group of States.
- 3. In accordance with section 9 of the Agreement, the Finance Committee shall be composed of 15 members with appropriate qualifications relevant to financial matters. Members of the Finance Committee shall be elected by the Assembly.
- 4. By a note verbale dated 15 March 2010, the Permanent Mission of Myanmar to the United Nations informed the secretariat of the Authority of the nomination of Zaw Minn Aung, First Secretary and Chief of the Administrative and Accounts Section of the Permanent Mission, as well as representative of Myanmar on the Sixth Committee of the United Nations General Assembly, to fill the vacant seat on the Finance Committee left by Mr. Han for the remainder of the term of Mr. Han ending 31 December 2011. The curriculum vitae of Mr. Aung appears in the annex I to the present document.





5. By a note verbale dated 1 April 2010, the Permanent Mission of India to the United Nations informed the secretariat of the Authority of the nomination of Pradip Kumar Choudhary, Counsellor (Legal Adviser) of the Permanent Mission and representative of India on the Sixth Committee of the United Nations General Assembly, to fill the vacant seat on the Finance Committee left by Mrs. Chadha for the remainder of the term of Mrs. Chadha ending 31 December 2011.
