New member of the International Seabed Authority

Note by the Secretary-General

1. Since the nineteenth session of the Assembly, one State has become party to the United Nations Convention on the Law of the Sea and is therefore a new member of the International Seabed Authority: the Niger (which became a member of the Authority on 6 September 2013).

2. In accordance with financial regulation 6.9, new members of the Authority shall be required to make a contribution for the year in which they became members of the Authority and to provide their proportion of the total advances to the working capital fund at such rates as may be determined by the Assembly. In accordance with financial regulation 7, such contributions for 2013 and 2014 shall be classed as miscellaneous income.

3. The assessed contributions due from the Niger for 2013 and 2014, and its proportionate share of the total advances to the working capital fund have been calculated on a pro rata basis, according to the scale of assessments for 2013 and 2014, as shown in the table below.
