





Decision of the Assembly of the International Seabed Authority relating to the strategic plan of the Authority for the period 2019–2023

The Assembly of the International Seabed Authority,

Recalling its decision of 18 August 2017, at the twenty-third session of the International Seabed Authority,¹ to request, inter alia, the Secretary-General, in view of the importance of a long-term plan defining the strategic direction and aims of the Authority, to submit a draft strategic plan to the Assembly for consideration at its twenty-fourth session, in 2018, and to regularly inform member States on progress with respect to the plan,

Recalling also that all twenty-nine exploration contracts currently signed by the Authority will be in force during the period of the plan,

Acknowledging the challenges for the Authority raised by the transition from exploration to exploitation,

Emphasizing the importance of ensuring that the strategic plan is kept under regular review and the results monitored for effectiveness,

 Adopts the strategic plan of the International Seabed Authority for the period 2019–2023, as contained in the annex, which provides a uniform basis for the strengthening of existing working practices of the Authority;

Invites members of the Authority and observers, as well as the organs of the Authority, to support the implementation of the strategic plan;

 Requests the Secretary-General, as a matter or priority, to prepare a highlevel action plan and to include key performance indicators and a list of outputs for the next five years, taking into account available financial and human resources, for consideration by the Assembly at its twenty-fifth session;

 Also requests the Secretary-General to provide the Assembly with a detailed overview of the implementation mechanisms to be established, including for monitoring, evaluation and learning;

Considering that the high-level action plan identifies the actions necessary to achieve the objectives in the strategic plan, as well as the priorities for the period 2019-2023, in relation to the actions required of the Authority to realize its mission objectives,

Committed to the strengthening of existing working practices of the Authority,

Emphasizing the importance of ensuring that the performance of the Authority towards achieving the strategic directions set out in the strategic plan is assessed in a regular manner and that the results are monitored for effectiveness.
