
WHAT IS THE ROLE OF A SPONSORING STATE?

Annex III, Article 4(3) of UNCLOS Within the context of Deep Seabed, 'Each applicant shall be sponsored by the State Party of which it is a national... or effectively controlled by that State Party....'

Sponsoring State(s) have the responsibility to ensure within their legal systems that an applicant/ contractor sponsored by it carry out activities in the Area in conformity with the terms of its contract and obligations under UNCLOS



Obligations on sponsoring States




Responsibility to ensure compliance by Contractor (Obligation of conduct)



Obligation of

'due diligence' and to make best efforts (adopt national laws, regulations and administrative measures)



Issue a certificate of sponsorship and exercise effective control



Obligations on sponsoring States

Regulations, Standards and guidance

Not impose unnecessary regulatory burden on sponsored party

Inquiry into incidents and providing assistance in responding

Keep records of documentations

Evaluation of application

Review of EIA

Liaise with & notification to ISA

Certificate of Sponsorship

Apply a Precautionary

Approach


Exercise effective control
