**Regulation 45**

**Development of environmental Standards**

- (1) Environmental Standards shall be developed in accordance with regulation 94 and shall include the following subject matters:
- (a) Environmental quality objectives, including but not limited to thresholds on biodiversity status, plume toxicity, density and extent, ~~and~~ sedimentation rates; and noise and light emissions;
  - (b) Baseline Data collection
  - (c) Technical requirements with regard to the equipment used for the exploitation activities
  - (d) Monitoring procedures; and
  - (e) Mitigation measures and/or remediation of environmental harm.
- (2) The Authority shall not approve any exploitation activities unless all relevant environmental standards referenced in the regulations are adopted. Standards shall be regularly revised by the Authority, in response to advancements in scientific knowledge.

**4. Please indicate the rationale for the proposal. [150 word limit]**

Exploitation activities shall be subject to effective environmental protection as provided for in Art. 145 UNCLOS. Effective environmental protection requires legally binding standards (and not guidelines) notably regarding the subject matters mentioned in Para 1a) and on baseline data collection as provided for in Para 1b). Para 2 ensures that exploitation activities do not commence without such legally binding standards.
