Excellency,

The United Nations Commission on Limits of the Continental Shelf (CLCS) in its 37th Session held at New York in March, 2015, accepted Pakistan's claim on extension in the outer limits of its Continental Shelf from 200 to 350 nautical miles. Pakistan was formally notified of this decision, by the Commission, vide its letter No. 2015_03_19_COM_LET_PAK_010 dated 19th March, 2015.

Article 84 Para 2 of the UNCLOS-1982, requires the coastal states, having their continental shelf extended under Article-76, to give due publicity to the Charts or Lists of the Geographical Points indicating the outer-limits lines of the Continental Shelf and deposit these charts/lists with Secretary General of the United Nations as well as the Secretary General of the International Seabed Authority.

Accordingly, in order to fulfill our obligation under Article 84(2) of UNCLOS, two copies each of the Chart depicting outer limits of continental shelf of Pakistan along with table of coordinates of outer limits points are forwarded herewith.

Pursuant to article 76, paragraph 9, of the United Nations Convention on the Law of the Sea, the outer limit of the continental shelf of Pakistan in the North Arabian Sea beyond 200 nautical miles from the baselines from which the breadth of the territorial sea is measured is established, in conformity with the recommendations of the Commission on the Limits of the Continental Shelf approved by the Commission, on 13 March 2015, by straight lines not exceeding 60 M in length connecting fixed points with the following geographical coordinates of latitude and longitude defined by reference to geodetic systems WGS84:
