Regulation 102

2. All [mining vessels Installations] and mining collectors [involved in exploitation activities under the Exploitation contract activities] shall be fitted with [an electronic monitoring system] [asatellite positioning device]. Such system shall record [in real time], inter alia, the date, time and position of all mining activities, [and, where technically possible, shall also provide environmental data]. The detail and frequency of reporting shall be in accordance with the Standards and taking into account the Guidelines.

2.bis The Contractor shall use the best-available techniques to monitor in real-time and in the actual environment the mining impact, including the removal of mineral resources, plume dispersal, and sound, allowing for adaptive management during the mining operation.

Para 2 – The UK supports the use of electronic monitoring equipment to establish the location of mining equipment and to support environmental monitoring. However, the UK's main concern is how this Regulation with the amendments unhelpfully conflates both of the issues which in turns creates complications in how the data is collected, transmitted and to whom it is provided.

Para 2 bis – The UK supports the making of environmental data publicly available, including remote monitoring data, however the UK recognizes that there may be

security concerns relating to the release of data pinpointing the precise location of mining equipment. This should be linked in a separate environmental Regulation to environmental provisions in Part IV Regs 46 ter and Regs 48 at least.
