In paragraph 1bis, we note that the language appears to be duplicative of requirements that will be established in the Standards for the Environmental Management System and in the requirements for applicants/contractors to comply with these Standards. Accordingly, we do not recommend retaining this text. Additionally, we do not recommend retaining the text in paragraph 1ter, since compliance with all regulations should be a fundamental term of contracts, and highlighting regulation 46 as done here may add uncertainty in this regard.

In paragraph 2 (e), the United States proposes that the text also include consideration of “Best Available Scientific Evidence, Best Environmental Practices and Best Available Techniques”, and we note that “Internationally recognized standards” as used in the text here is not defined or used elsewhere in the text and we believe that this wording would more fully encompass what is expected.
