3. Meeting Participants

• Official representatives of the following member States of the International Seabed authority: *Angola, Botswana, Swaziland, Lesotho, Liberia, Malawi, Mozambique, Namibia, Sao Tome and Principe, South Africa, Zimbabwe* and *Zambia*.

• Representatives of international and regional organizations (International Seabed Authority, Africa Union, UNDOALOS, African Minerals Development Centre) including experts from the Legal and Technical Commission of the International Seabed Authority

• African experts in law, mining, engineering, economics.

4. Registration and Badges

• All participants are required to register for the conference and obtain an ID badge. A registration table will be set up in the designated room on **Thursday 16th May 2019** from 9.00 am to 9.30 am where the ID badges can be obtained.

5. Arrival and Departure

• Both arrivals and departures should be planned to and from <u>OR Tambo</u> <u>International Airport.</u>

6. Transport to and from Airport

• Transportation can be made available for participants from the airport to confirmed accommodations and back to the airport after the Conference (see point 8 'Accommodation' below). The cost incurred will be covered by each participant.

• Please note that participants can also arrange their own transport arrangements to and from the airport.

7. Visa Requirements

• The following categories of the UN staff are exempt from visa requirements when visiting the Republic of South Africa for periods not exceeding 90 days, and for official business purposes and transits, provided they are in possession of the relevant letters or identification documents to identify themselves at ports of entry as personnel of an UN agency:

- Holders of United Nations Laissez-passers
- Volunteers attached to the UN

- Persons involved in any United Nations agency
- Persons performing services on behalf of the UN.

- Passport must at least contain 2 blank pages available.

• All individuals who have visited a yellow fever area in the last six weeks would need to present a valid yellow fever certificate.

9. Daily Subsistence Allowance (DSA)

• The International Seabed Authority will provide DSA to the sponsored participants. Participants are to complete their Banking Details and submit the appropriate for to **Ms. Trudi-Ann Herdsman** (travel@isa.org.jm) in order for the request to be processed.

- An advance of 75% of the DSA will deposited to the participant's identified bank account, prior to travel. The remaining 25% and terminal will be paid upon submission of requested travel documentations at the completion of the Workshop (F10 form).
- The sponsored participants will be entitled to 4 days DSA in the amount of USD\$164.00 per day and terminal expenses (TRM) to cover airport transfers and incidentals.
- The following are the required documents for claiming the DSA and TRM:
 - copy of the passport bio page
 - copy of e-ticket
 - boarding passes
 - banking details

- South Africa is the "Rainbow Nation", a title that captures the country's cultural and ethnic diversity. The population of South Africa is one of the most complex and diverse in the world. Of the 51.7 million South Africans, over 41 million are black, 4.5 million are white, 4.6 million are coloured and about 1.3 million Indian or Asian. About 51.3% are female, and 48.7% male.
- Official Language: Sepedi, Sesotho, Setswana, siSwati, Tshivenda, Xitsonga, Afrikaans, English, isiNdebele, isiXhosa and isiZulu.
- Time difference: South Africa Time is 2 hours ahead of Greenwich Mean Time (GMT+2).

19. Religions

• South Africa is a secular State with a diverse religious population. Its constitution guarantees freedom of religion. Many religions are represented in the ethnic and regional diversity of the population. Christianity, especially in its Protestant forms, predominates.

20. Business Hours
