#### 5. Please indicate the rationale for the proposal. [150-word limit]

Regarding paragraph 3, the Convention neither stipulates nor presupposes the future establishment of the so-called "Inspectorate", and it is suggested to delete it. The issuance of a compliance notice by the Secretary-General goes beyond the provisions of the Convention, which falls within the competence of the Council. For example, Article 162 (2) (a) of the Convention provides that the Council shall supervise and coordinate the implementation of the provisions of this part on all questions and matters within the competence of the Authority and invite the attention of the Assembly to cases of non-compliance.

Regarding paragraph 3.bis, it is proposed to clarify the nature and meaning of "The plan" and its relationship to other plans in the Draft Regulations. At present, many problems and details about the electronic monitoring system are still unclear, and it

needs to be further studied and discussed. The text should be further streamlined, and details should be specified in standards or guidelines.

Regarding paragraph 5, the Convention neither stipulates nor presupposes the future establishment of the so-called "Inspectorate", and it is suggested to delete it.
