Regarding paragraph 3, the extension of an exploitation contract is not necessarily together with the revision of a Plan of Work, which should be treated on a case-by-case basis. In the circumstances of non-material changes, it can follow a simplified procedure. While in the circumstances of material changes, the Contractor needs to submit a revised plan of work.

Regarding paragraph 6 (b) bis, the attribution of cumulative environmental impact is uncertain. In other word, it cannot necessarily attribute to the Contractor. It is recommended to conduct an in-depth study on the cumulative environmental impact before whether to use it as a factor for deciding the renewal of the exploitation contract.
