Draft Regulation 2: Principles, approaches and policies

- 3. Exploitation activities in the Area shall not commence until, inter alia, the legal framework intended for the effective protection and preservation of the Marine Environment is adopted and scientific evidence and other relevant knowledge/evidence (including traditional knowledge of Indigenous Peoples and local communities) demonstrates that the Exploitation activities are conducted in such a manner as not to cause significant and harmful changesharmful effects to the Marine Environment and its resources and to effectively protect and preserve the Marine Environment pursuant to article 145 and Part XII of UNCLOS.

According to article 145 of the Convention, the effective protection of the marine environment from the harmful effects which may arise from activities of exploitation, in accordance with the Authority's environmental policy, including regional environmental management plans, is based inter alia on the following principles and approaches:

- (v) Access to data and information relating to the protection and preservation of the Marine Environment, subject to regulation 89.

The FSM proposes amending DR 2(3) to reference the relevance of traditional knowledge of Indigenous Peoples and local communities as one of the bases (along with scientific evidence) for demonstrating that Exploitation activities are conducted in a manner that avoids harmful effects to the Marine Environment, among other conditions. For the same paragraph (3), the FSM also proposes to make clear that proceeding with Exploitation activities is dependent on meeting conditions that are not limited to those in paragraph (3). Finally, for DR 2(4)(v), the FSM proposes inserting a reference to regulation 89 ("Confidentiality of information") in order to, among other things, safeguard the rights of Indigenous Peoples and local communities pertaining to their traditional knowledge, which can only be accessed with the free, prior, and informed consent of such knowledge holder. (The FSM will propose parallel language to this effect in DR 89 as well when the Council addresses that DR.)
