- In considering baseline data, the Scoping Report should include consideration of any gaps in the necessary baseline data and information and the steps that will be taken to address them. We have suggested text to this effect in a new bbis.
- In part (g)(i), impact duration as well as magnitude should be considered in the environmental risk assessment.
- The identification of high priority risks should include cumulative effects involving the project together with authorized, anticipated, or expected activities, actions and natural phenomena, and we have suggested text to this effect in a new ibis.
- In part (I), the consideration of alternatives to be examined in detail in the EIA should be those that are *reasonable* rather than "feasible", and include consideration of a no-action alternative. Even where there are no technically or economically feasible alternatives, the EIA should still consider the alternative of "no action" as a means of meaningfully assessing the effects of the proposed action from the environmental baseline.
- Finally, in part (I), we consider that in presenting which alternatives have been selected for detailed examination in the EIA, that the phrase "not carried forward for further analysis" be used rather than "discounted," for clarity.
