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The Foreign, Commonwealth and Development Office of the United Kingdom presents its compliments to the Secretary-General of the International Seabed Authority (ISA) and has the honour to refer to discussions by Australia, Canada, Costa Rica, Federated States of Micronesia, New Zealand, Norway, United States of America and the United Kingdom on the subject of Standardisation of Stakeholder consultations within the draft exploitation Regulations.
