**Regulation 46bis** 

Environmental impact assessment

(...)

4. The environmental impact assessment process shall:

(a) Be based on relevant baseline data that captures temporal, seasonal and spatial variation in accordance with Standards and <u>taking into account</u> the relevant Regional Environmental Management Plan;

(b) Include an environmental risk assessment and a survey of the seabed to identify Underwater Cultural Heritage, that takes into consideration the region as a whole, in accordance with taking into account the objectives and measures of the relevant and applicable Regional Environmental Management Plan;

(...)

9. The Environmental Impact Statement shall be in the form prescribed by the Authority in annex IV to these regulations and shall:

(a) Demonstrate that the proposed mining operation is in accordance with all relevant environmental Standards and <u>takes into account</u> with the requirements of the relevant Regional Environmental Management Plan.
