This text in (a) has been suggested to retain consistency with the language used in previously discussed text under 46ter paragraph 4. Some contractors have already shown ability to share monitoring data in near real time. Including this language in the text will also increase ambition for contractors to share monitoring data quicker to the public. Canada proposes the deletion of "apply best endeavours to improve" suggestion, and would prefer to retain the original language in this paragraph. Ensuring the effective protection of the Marine Environment from harmful effects is a requirement for contractors, and all applicable mitigation and management measures to provide this level of protection should be implemented.
