DR 55 alt. The Environmental Compensation Fund has two purposes:

- 1. In the event that there is environmental damage caused by contractor activities that WeTe not consented, then in accordance with the polluter pays principle the contractor shall bear liability for the financing of any measure to Mitigate that environmental damage and shall also be liable for compensation to any person affected by that environmental damage, but if the contractor is unable to meet that liability in full, then, as a last resort, the environmental compensation fund may be called upon; and
- 2. In the event that there is unforeseen environmental damage caused by contractor activities that were consented activities then the environmental liability fund shall be used to finance any measure to mitigate that environmental damage and compensate any person affected by that environmental damage.'

The African Group considers that the purpose of the Environmental Compensation Fund should be clear at the outset, and that this regulation would benefit from streamlining. As such, we propose an alt Regulation 55. Details as listed in the original wording would be best placed in the Rules and Procedures of the Fund (to be drafted by the Finance Committee) and Standards and Guidelines where necessary.
