Statement by H.E. Mr. ATSUMI Yasuhiro, Permanent Representative of Japan to the International Seabed Authority on Agenda Item 8: Annual Report of the Secretary-General at the Assembly of the Twenty-Eighth Session of the International Seabed Authority Kingston, August 2023

Japan would like to express its sincere appreciation to **Secretary-General Michael Lodge** for his comprehensive report covering the wide range of activities undertaken by the Authority over the past 12 months.

Japan strongly supports the **invaluable role** played by the Authority in the international management of the **exploration for** and **exploitation of mineral resources** in the Area and highly values the Authority's continuous implementation of its mission under the leadership of the Secretary-General in accordance with **the United Nations Convention on the Law of the Sea** and **the Agreement relating to the Implementation of Part XI of UNCLOS**.

Japan appreciates the **considerable progress** made since last year's Assembly by the Authority on the important work of developing the **regulations for the exploitation of mineral resources** in the Area. Japan welcomes the strong commitment of all parties concerned in the deliberations on the regulations towards achieving our shared objective of establishing **a robust legal framework** which ensures **protection of the marine environment** and **sustainable use of its resources**. Although there is a considerable amount of work ahead, Japan is confident that Member States, contractors, scientists, and observers will work together to **advance substantive discussions** in good faith, under **the leadership of Secretary-General Lodge**. To date, Japan has played a leading role in advancing scientific knowledge in **mining technologies** and in **protecting the marine environment** based on its experience of over 40 years of seabed mining. Japan would like to continue to share its expertise in the course of the **drafting process of the Regulations** and beyond. At the same time, **capacity development** in the field of the deep sea is one of our priorities in the context of activities in the Area. In light of this, we are delighted to inform that **Japanese contractors** have provided **training opportunities including on-board training** for a total of 10 trainees from 9 countries this year, and one further training opportunity for 5 participants is scheduled for later this year.

In closing, I would like to reiterate Japan's full commitment to UNCLOS and to **protecting the marine environment and biodiversity**. In this regard, I am particularly pleased to inform all the participants of the Assembly that Japan will be hosting a workshop on "Regional Environmental Management Plan in the Area of Northwest Pacific Ocean" in February next year in Tokyo. Recognizing the everincreasing importance of promoting deep seabed mining that would bring **the shared benefits** which UNCLOS expects while **ensuring effective protection of the marine environment**, Japan remains committed to working closely with the Authority and all Member States as well as stakeholders towards making progress in the **development of comprehensive rules, regulations and procedures** in the Area and advancing **a legal order** in the ocean.
