"Ecosystem Approach" means a comprehensive, integrated approach to the management of human activities based on the Best Available Scientific [Information Evidence] and, where available, relevant traditional knowledge of Indigenous Peoples and local communities that accounts for marine ecosystems and their dynamics, in order to achieve ecosystems' conservation and sustainable use of, and the avoidance of interference with, the ecological balance of the marine environment.

"Serious Harm" means any effect from activities in the Area on the Marine Environment which represents a[n [unlawful]] significant adverse change in the Marine Environment determined according to the rules, regulations and procedures adopted by the Authority on the basis of internationally recognized standards and practices informed by Best Available Scientific [Evidence] [Information] and, where available, relevant traditional knowledge of Indigenous Peoples and local communities.
