If the Council does not approve adopt such Standards, the Council shall return the Standards to the Commission for reconsideration in the light of the views expressed by the Council. The Standards approved adopted by the Council shall remain effective on a provisional basis until approved by the Assembly or until amended by the Council in the light of any views expressed by the Assembly.
