As a general comment, we believe it is helpful to have this more fleshed-out regulation 16 (rather than the alt proposal), including the addition of new paras 3 and 4.

We prefer deleting para 2. While this is derived from paragraph 11 of section 3 to the Annex of the 1994 Agreement, we would urge the Council not to allow this situation to occur, which could see a plan of work for exploitation inadvertently approved by default and without positive approval from the Council. A mechanism could be implemented to ensure the 60-day period does not lapse without decision from the Council - for example there should be an automatic extension of the time period, if the Council is not due to meet within that 60-day deadline. (We note as well, in relation to this provision, that it also does not include an equivalent presumption of deemed disapproval, where the recommendation from the LTC was for disapproval, which seems one-sided. Also the provision seems ambiguous from when the 60-day time limit runs).
