Regulation 75 [OEWG] Audit by the Authority

1. <u>At most once per year, Thethe CouncilCommission</u>, on its own initiative, or upon the request of the Secretary-General or the commission, may, upon a genuine belief of non-compliance by a <u>Contractor in regard to royalty payments</u>, request an audit of the Contractor's books and records and all subcontractors' books and records associated with the Exploitation activities in the Area.

5. Please indicate the rationale for the proposal. [150-word limit]

- We support the Commission having the ability to request an audit of Contractors' records relating to exploitation activities in the Area. However, we consider this should be subject to an appropriate threshold of concern or belief that such an audit is necessary. We have proposed amendments to Draft Regulation 75(1) accordingly.
- Due to the cost and time required for complying with such requests, we also suggest limiting such audits to once per annum.
- In relation to subcontractors, we note that Contractors themselves may not have a right to inspect all of the records of their subcontractors. This is also likely outside of the jurisdiction of the Authority given subcontractors are not in a contractual relationship with the Authority. As such, we propose to remove this reference.
