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**TREATY ON DELIMITATION OF MARINE AREAS AND MARITIME
COOPERATION BETWEEN THE REPUBLIC OF PANAMA AND THE
REPUBLIC OF COSTA RICA, SIGNED IN SAN JOSÉ, COSTA RICA, ON
FEBRUARY 2, 1980.**

1. In the Caribbean Sea: The median line whose points are all equidistant from the closest points of the baselines from which the width of the territorial sea of each State is measured according to Public International Law, from the end of the land boundary between both countries at a point located at the mouth of the Sixaola River North latitude 09° 34' 16" West longitude 82°34'00", starting with a straight line to a point located at North latitude 10°49'00", starting with a straight line to a point located at North latitude 10°49'00" West longitude 81°26'08.2, where the limits of Costa Rica, Colombia and Panama intersect.

2. In the Pacific Ocean: The median line whose points are all equidistant from the closest points of the baselines from which the width of the territorial sea of each State is measured according to Public International Law, the limit within the maritime areas of both countries will constitute the straight line that, starting from the southern end of the land limit in Punta Burica, reaches a point on the parallel of North Latitude 05°00'00", and longitude 84°19'00" West of Greenwich.

**TREATY ON DELIMITATION OF MARINE AND SUBMARINE AREAS
AND RELATED MATTERS BETWEEN THE REPUBLIC OF COLOMBIA
AND THE REPUBLIC OF PANAMA.**

In the Caribbean Sea:

1. The median line whose points are all equidistant from the closest points of the baselines from which the width of the territorial sea of each State is measured, from the point where the international land border reaches the sea at Cape Tiburón (North latitude 8°41'07"3 and north longitude 12°30'00" and west longitude 78°00'00").

In accordance with the principle of equidistance agreed here, except for some small deviations that have been agreed to simplify the layout, the median line in the Caribbean Sea is constituted by the straight lines drawn between the following points:

2. Starting from the point located at North Latitude 12°30'00" and West Longitude 78°00'00", the delimitation of the marine and underwater areas belonging to each of the two States is constituted by a series of straight lines drawn between the following points:

Punto H:	12°30'00"	78°00'00"
Punto I:	12°30'00"	79°00'00"
Punto J:	11°50'00"	79°00'00"
Punto K:	11°50'00"	80°00'00"
Punto L:	11°00'00"	80°00'00"
Punto M:	11°00'00"	81°15'00"

From point M, the delimitation continues along a straight line with azimuth 225° (45° southwest) to where the delimitation of the maritime borders must be done with a third State.

B. In the Pacific

1) The median line whose points are all equidistant from the closest points of the baselines from which the width of the territorial sea of each State is measured, from the point where the international land border reaches the sea at North Latitude 7°12' 39"3 and West Longitude 77°53'20", to the point located at North Latitude 5°00'00" and West Longitude 79°52'00".

In accordance with the principle of equidistance agreed here, except for some small deviations that have been agreed to simplify the layout, the median line in the Pacific Ocean is constituted by straight lines between the following points:

Punto F:	5°00'00"	79°14'00"

2) Starting from the point located at North Latitude 5°00'00" and West Longitude 79°52'00" the delimitation of the marine and underwater areas belonging to each of the two States is constituted by the parallel 5°00' 00" to the extent that the delimitation must be made with a third State.

Paragraph: The agreed lines and points are indicated in the nautical charts that, signed by the Plenipotentiaries, are added to this Treaty as Annexes 1 and II, it being understood that in any case the tenor of the Treaty will prevail.
