Regulation 47

The applicant or Contractor shall, in accordance with the Standards, and taking into consideration account the Guidelines, undertake an impact assessment, [as described in Regulation 46 (4),] based on the Terms of Reference [agreed] agreed in the Scoping report, [to describe the impacts on the marine environment and Underwater Cultural Heritage and to predict the nature and extent of the Environmental Effects of the mining operation, including residual impacts, on the marine environment and Underwater Cultural Heritage, also considering cumulative impacts, including existing and foreseen mining operations, other activities and natural phenomena.] This includes assessing:

(<u>f</u>) The timing and duration of the impact relative to the period in which a species needs the habitat during one or more of its life history stages affected for its long survival.

We suggest that the term "agreed" is retained in paragraph (1) to ensure that there is clear agreement between the contractor and the Authority as to the level and amount of work that must be done for the EIA, prior to undertaking the assessment. This would also be consistent with regulation 47 bis(8)(c) which provides that before proceeding with an EIA, the contractor should agree the final contents of the terms of reference in the scoping report with the Commission.

For sub-paragraph 1(f), we would highlight that if this were to be moved to become a standard, it would not be feasible to know with certainty the life histories of all species of the marine environment that may be impacted. We also highlight that no equivalent or similar requirement is provided for in the Exploration recommendations.
