 - (c) bis a summary of any uncertainties inherent in the Plan of Work and how the applicant has proposed to address these;

 - (a) the Plan of Work does not comply with all requirements stipulated in Regulation 13 and Regulation 12(4); ...
 - (c) Bis Such approval would undermine or contradict the binding goals, objectives or measures set out in other global frameworks and agreements related to the protection of the Marine Environment;

At its next available meeting, t<u>The</u> Commission shall consider any such representations made by the applicant when preparing its reports and recommendations to the Council, provided that the representations have been circulated at least 30 Days in advance of that meetingwhich it shall do within 30 days of its receipt of such representations including through intersessional or virtual meetings if necessary.

<u>Paragraph 1.Alt:</u> it would not be appropriate to provide the Commission with discretion regarding whether it recommends approval of applications that meet all the criteria and requirements stipulated in the regulations. As an expert body, the Commission's sole task is to assess applications against the set criteria. There are no other factors that should be able to influence the outcome of its considerations. Proposed paragraph 1.Alt would allow the Commission to decline to recommend approval for reasons other than the application not meeting those requirements and prefer paragraph 1 accordingly.

<u>Paragraph 1.bis(b):</u> we note the use of the word "inputs" in pargraph 1.bis)(b), which we consider to be less clear as compared to "considerations".

<u>Paragraph 2(c) Bis:</u> this paragraph is ambiguous and lacks clarity or certainty. It is unclear what this paragraph is attempting to do or what "other global frameworks and agreements" it would require the Commission to consider when assessing applications. It is also not clear how an approval could "undermine or contradict" these frameworks, particularly where they meet all of the requirements established by the Authority in accordance with the Convention. We suggest this paragraph 2(c) Bis is deleted.

<u>Paragraph 5:</u> consistent with other submissions, we do not consider that the Commission's consideration of representations by applicants needs to be linked to its schedule of meetings. To enhance the efficiency of the Commission's work it should consider such representations intersessionally and within a reasonable period after their receipt. This would also help ensure that the Commission meets its deadlines for considering and reporting on applications.
